31 October is **Reformation Day**. It is a Protestant Christian religious holiday. It commemorates the day in 1517 when the German monk and theologian, **Martin Luther**, nailed his 95 theses (reform proposals) on the door of Wittenburg Castle Church. Luther condemned the excesses and corruption of the Roman Catholic Church at that time, especially the papal practice called 'indulgences' for the forgiveness of sin.

Many Lutheran and some reformed Churches hold special church services. The Catholic Church officially recognises Reformation Day and, in a spirit of ecumenical relations, approves official representatives to attend various commemoration events.
